Message from our Pastor

Studies show that the number one reason people visit a church is because they were invited by a friend or relative. Here is the breakdown from one such study:

- 2% by Advertisement
- 6% by the Pastoral Invitation
- 6% by organized evangelism campaign
- 86% by friends or relatives

Another study asked active church attendees how many times they have personally, invited an unchurched person to attend a church service or some other program?

- 48% of church attendees responded, "zero."
- 33% percent said they've personally invited someone one or two times.
- 19% say they've done so on three or more occasions in the last six months

As part of your Lenten discipline, I ask that you pray for people in your life who do not have a church home. Think of family members and friends, co-workers, neighbors, acquaintances and people under personal life stresses who need to know of God's love and hope. And pray for God to empower you to have the right words and timing to give a church invitation.

In addition, I would like to ask each of you to reflect on what

Providence can do to increase the overall sense of satisfaction and inspiration for the congregation. How can we do a better job at being church? Share your thoughts with me or with an Elder. This is not an easy time to be the church and so to do it well requires us to all take part.

Join us during Lent!

February 10th, Ash Wednesday, is the first day of our 40-day (six-week) journey to the cross with Jesus. During Lent, we strip the sanctuary of decorations and ornamentations to parallel what we are also doing in our lives. Lent is a time of deep reflection and a deepening of our faith. It is a time when we are called to Prayer, Fasting and Charity. Christians fast from something (sweets, fast food, Facebook, TV, etc.), give more from our finances, and add the discipline of prayer and study to our lives. These spiritual disciplines prepare our hearts and minds for the incredible sacrifice of the cross and the power of the Resurrection.


Providence Adult Sunday School



Speaker, Dr. Richard Weis, Vice President of Academic Affairs at Lexington Theological Seminary says, "The prophets of the Old Testament were immersed in the religious, political and social realities of their own times, in some ways not so different from ours. And yet, they spoke to them so powerfully that their words echo across the centuries. The prophets were carriers of a powerful vision and hope for what human life together on this planet could be."

Co-sponsored by Lexington Theological Seminary, the workshop seeks to broaden the skills of elders and deacons, offer time to share successes and challenges, and make possible a deepening of faith understanding.

Just a little over two centuries ago the pioneers of the first Restoration Movement Church stood on the belief that Christians should be a unified, single body, patterned after the Church of the New Testament. Today, we gather in churches each Sunday that emerged from this idea. More

than 20,000 churches spread across the US as well as thousands in other countries attribute this moment in history to their existence as well.

However, with much growth has also come division and weakened the body of our church.

Restoration 200 is about reviving the core values of the Restoration Movement – Unity, Liberty and Love. Our future as a church is rooted in the past, in the person of Jesus Christ, in who the New Testament calls the church to be, and in what the Restoration Movement stands for. We must be as strategic about focusing the next 200 years of our church as the enemy will be in obstructing it.
