# Message from our Pastor

My grandmother said, "you are what you eat." And we all understand that eating junk food is bad for our bodies, but what and how we eat also affects our spiritual health. When I was a kid, fast food restaurants were a new thing. My grandparents' generation mostly raised their children on the food that they grew. The process of preparing, eating and cleaning up from a meal was a family – slow – event. Mealtime was sacred and spirits were nourished along with bodies.

We Disciples are People of the Table. Communion is central to our worship and to our theology. Each time we gather around the Lord's Table we are reminded how we are connected to God through Christ, to one another, and to the earth. We are reminded of God's love and endless grace. It is the most sacred time of the week.

In the September 2016 newsletter, I informed you that Providence was awarded a Food and Faith study grant by the Lilly Endowment. The grant is allowing me to take the summer off to rest, to study and read, and to travel to Italy in June. My family and I will visit Rome, Florence, Cinque Terre, and Venice together. John-Mark and I will visit the Lake Region of the northwest and I will spend a week alone at a spiritual retreat in Assisi. We will do a food tour and a farm tour. We will worship with Pope Francis and visit many sacred sites. Then in July and August, I will read a lot of books, do some much needed house work, and worship in different churches. In August, I will travel with a small group to Venezuela to connect with Disciple partners there and, in late August, I will attend a food and faith retreat with clergy women.

While I am gone Rev. Jerry Shepard will be your pastor and preacher. Jerry retired after serving 23 years at South Elkhorn and for many years (10+) at First Christian in Danville where I did my student ministry. Jerry is a strong man of faith and a good preacher and pastor. He and his wife, Candy, will worship with us May 28<sup>th</sup> and look forward to meeting you all. The grant will also pay for a guest speaker/preacher on Food and Faith, for each household to receive a Food and Faith book and for 30 PCC folks to attend a cooking class (see page 2).

Please pray for me as I will be praying for you. Stay active at Providence because God does not take a vacation and neither does the church. We will need VBS and Habitat workers. The grass will need to be mowed and the Hospice families will need food delivered. Our shut-ins will need to be visited and called. Our youth will be going on mission trips. And every Sunday at 10:45 AM the faithful will gather to worship God through songs, prayers, proclamation, offering and the Lord's Supper because, "You are what you eat."

# Providence Book Club

We will meet May 22<sup>nd</sup>, at 5:30 PM at Bella Notte Restaurant at Fayette Mall. Our book for discussion is *News of the World* by Paulette Jiles.

It is 1870 and Captain Jefferson Kyle Kidd travels northern Texas giving live readings to paying audiences hungry for news of the world. In one town he is offered a \$50 gold piece to deliver a young orphan to relatives in San Antonio, a journey of 400 miles through unsettled, dangerous territory.

Four years earlier, Johanna's family was killed by a band of Kiowa raiders. She was spared and taken to be raised as one of

their own. Now 10 years old, she has forgotten the English language, tries to escape at every opportunity, throws away her shoes and refuses to act "civilized." The reunion with relatives – strangers who regard her as a burden – is neither happy nor welcome.

Exquisitely rendered and morally complex, News of the World is a brilliant work of historical fiction that explores the boundaries of family, responsibility, honor and trust.
