From our Pastor

I grew up in a congregation led by a minister who was very involved and well respected in the Lexington Community. When I was a child, I remember being so proud of Rev. Glenn Burke when he appeared on a Lexington News show to debate a prominent atheist. Throughout my life, local issues were regularly brought before the congregation in a symposium platform where all sides of the issues were presented and discussed. As far as I knew, this was how all churches operated. I have come to know that is not the case.

This summer Lexington Theological Seminary invited Providence along with nine other congregations to take part in a Civil Dialogue program. Over 400 people from these ten churches filled out a survey on how much various current issues are discussed in their church and/or by their pastors. (Thanks to those of you who filled out that survey.) Each of the ten congregations sent their pastor and one lay leader to a two-day training on how to lead civil dialogue discussions. Beth Waits and I represented Providence at that training in September. As part of the program we agreed to host two civil dialogues in the fall and spring. A follow up survey will then follow.

The format for these two dialogues will be an introductory sermon, a two-hour dialogue on a chosen topic, and a follow-up sermon that looks at the topic through the lens of the Gospel. Beth and I are excited to lead our first Civil Dialogue on October 27th on the topic of the opioid crisis. The sermon on that day will introduce civil dialogue, and then from 12:30-2:30, Beth and I will lead participants through the process which will end in potential actions for our congregation. On November 3rd there will be a follow-up sermon on what was shared in the discussion.

We would like everyone who is able to take part in the Civil Dialogue on October 27th. Please mark your calendars and plan to join us. You will have the opportunity to RSVP when we get closer to the date, as we will serve a simple lunch. If we can't discuss tough current issues with our church family, where can we?




Providence Book Club

At our October 28th meeting we will discuss "Sing, Unburied, Sing" by Jesmyn Ward.

Jojo is thirteen years old and trying to understand what it means to be a man. He doesn't lack fathers to study, chief among them his black grandfather, Pop, and other men who complicate his understanding: his absent white father, Michael, who is

being released from prison, his absent white grandfather, Big Joseph, who won't acknowledge his existence; and the memories of his dead uncle, Given, who died as a teenager.

His mother, Leonie, is an inconsistent presence in his and his toddler sister's lives. She is black and her children's father is white. She wants to be a better mother but can't put her children above her own needs, especially her drug use. When Michael is released from prison, Leonie packs her kids and a friend into her car and drives north to the heart of Mississippi and Parchman Farm, the State Penitentiary. At Parchman, there is another thirteen-yearold boy, the ghost of a dead inmate who carries all of the ugly history of the South with him in his wandering. He too has something to teach Jojo about fathers and sons, about legacies, about violence, about love.
