The Heart of the Matter

Well, well, we meet again! You didn't expect it, nor did I. I had the privilege to serve as your summer interim when Carol was on sabbatical a couple years ago. I have had the honor to preach a few times when Carol was gone. I never, however, expected to be your Interim Minister, because that would mean, Carol had left Providence. I am certain that this congregation is still in shock that Carol has gone. After nearly 8 years of Carol being your pastor it has got to be difficult to think of life at Providence without Carol. Her departure leaves a big hole in the middle of this church family. I have no illusions that I can fill that hole. I can't be Carol, I can only be me. I will preach, lead, deliberate, listen, visit, hug and play in the best ways I know how, but it won't be the way Carol would do those same things. So, I ask for your grace in excepting that I can't be Carol, and I will not expect Providence to be like the churches where I have served.

That being said, I know that you are grieving Carol's departure and I know that grief takes time for recovery. Be patient with yourself and with each other. Together, the church will regroup and refocus toward the mission to which God is calling her. Through the ages, the community of faith has been

resilient in the face of loss and disappointments. The source of their resiliency was found in the covenant (promise) that God had made with the nation. God reminds the people of God's commitment to them in these words from Isaiah 42. "I am the Lord, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes of the blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness.... See, the former things have come to pass, and the new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them."

I find comfort in those words, "I have taken you by the hand and kept you." I find excitement in the words, "The former things have come to pass," and now God declares, that God will be doing "new things"... in us, for us and through us. So we can look to the future with hope because we worship a God who is actively at work in the world and particularly through the church.

Exactly what God will do in and through Providence Christian Church in the future is a mystery right now, but the God who made a covenant with us through Jesus Christ and has "taken our hands" is bringing about new things - wonderful things. I am honored to be with you in discovering just what new things God will be doing through Providence Christian Church. I am looking forward to seeing you Sunday!

Donation to Providence Food Pantry




Thank you to Marksbury Farm Market of Lancaster, KY, for their generous annual donation of frozen meats to
