The Sunday evening worship service at Pax Christi for the Week of Christian Unity was indeed a wonderful service. The Unity Choir brought us beautiful music, we heard sermons from a Catholic Bishop and a Lutheran Bishop, and many clergy and youth from the area helped to lead the service. I was thrilled to see Providence Christian Church represented by EIGHT of our church members! The theme of the service was "they showed us unusual kindness." The scripture referenced when a ship that the Apostle Paul was on wrecked on a reef off the Island of Malta. After the ship was repaired, the natives of the island provided all the provisions that the ship needed to continue its journey to Italy. So we need to pull out all the stops and provide "unusual kindness" and show the love of Jesus that we have experienced, to our neighbors who will be visiting us on Scout Sunday. We will need everyone to make a commitment to be here on the 9th with a smile and a warm handshake and extra dishes of food to feed our cherished quests. Wouldn't it be wonderful, if when our quests go home that day, they will reflect on the love and kindness of Providence Christian Church! And who knows, a few might even come back to worship with us because on Scout Sunday they got a glimpse of what an extraordinary family of faith we have here at Providence.

During the month of February, the Providence Women's Service Group is collecting socks for residents of the Jessamine County Homeless Shelter.


The biggest need is for men's socks, some
