Maundy Thursday, April 9, 2020

"As often as you do it, do it in remembrance of me." You recognize those words from Jesus as he instituted the Lord's Supper. The command to remember Jesus through the Lord's Supper was given by our Lord on the night before his crucifixion. We get the word "maundy" from Latin which means mandate.

Therefore, on the Thursday of Holy Week, we remember Jesus' gift of his life, through our observance of communion. On Thursday, April 9 at 7:00 pm we will video our service on our Facebook page.
