From Our Pastor

Mahatma Gandhi is quoted as saying: "I like your Christ, I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike your Christ." In researching that quote to make sure I got the verbiage correct it seems that the quote is a bit disputed and Gandhi may not have actually said those words. Nevertheless, the sentiment is real and attributing the words to a respected historical figure isn't uncommon.

I've expressed in the past my personal reluctance to self identify as a Christian when introducing myself outside of church circles. There are many movements and personalities that loudly claim to be Christian who hold beliefs and ideologies that I believe to be antithetical to Christ's teachings. I have found it more beneficial to introduce my true self in word and deed rather than wear the assumptions that the Christian label brings with it these days.

However, I've discovered that this attitude has led to building an identity out of the negative. Meaning my identification sounds something like "I'm a Christian, but..." and I go on to say what I don't believe; which is usually something that those loud Christians proclaim. It feels like I'm always playing defense, trying to distance myself from a label or course correct from assumptions. So let me flip it and proclaim my beliefs, not what I don't believe.

As a Christian I believe that everyone is created in the image of God and that everyone is beloved by their creator regardless of their age, race, gender identification, place of birth, wealth, sexual preference, political affiliation, religious beliefs, or any other label that we as humans have created.

As a Christian I believe that the life, teachings, death, and resurrection of Jesus provide to me a reconciling path of relationship with God and my fellow humans. Following Christ's teachings is my foundational and guiding task.

To narrow down, I am an ordained minister in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). As a member of this movement, I believe in the centrality of scripture and recognize that each person has the freedom and responsibility to study God's Word.

I believe that our community should be structured around the biblical idea of covenant, emphasizing not obedience to human authority but accountability to one another because of our shared obedience to Christ.

That's a good start. I will no longer be describing what I am NOT. What I am is a beloved child of God who has found love and grace in the teachings of Christ through the study of Scripture and relationship with other believers. I strive to share that love and grace freely with all I meet the same way I found it, by building relationships and studying scripture with others.
